### Climate Change and Agriculture Together Halve Insect Populations

In recent years, researchers have reported alarming decreases in both the population numbers and the diversity of insects. These phenomena are often linked to the impacts of global climate change and habitat loss due to industrial agriculture. According to a study published in *Nature*, climate change and agriculture seem to have a synergistic effect on insect biodiversity, with each magnifying the declines caused by the other.

For the study, researchers from University College London (UCL) analysed data from more than 750,000 samples of nearly 18,000 insect species that were collected from 6,000 sites around the world over the last 20 years. They compared changes over time in the samples' reported numbers on insect populations and biodiversity to the average and maximum temperatures as well as land use at each site. Each area was categorised as having primary vegetation or low or high-intensity agriculture. The researchers found that rising temperatures are linked to greater population reductions and that there was more loss of species in areas where natural habitats were cleared to make room for agriculture than in undeveloped regions. Areas with temperature increases but undisturbed insect habitats, or disturbed habitats but relatively steady temperatures, experienced smaller losses. In high-intensity agriculture areas affected by rising temperatures one standard deviation above baseline fluctuations, such as some sites in Brazil, the number of insects dropped by up to 49 percent, and the number of species present dropped by 27 percent.

"In this case, the habitat loss and climate change can often be worse than if they were acting on their own, as one can make the impact of the other worse and vice versa," study author and UCL ecologist Charlotte Outhwaite tells the Associated Press. "We're missing part of the picture if we are only looking at these things individually." Part of the problem, Outhwaite explains, is that agricultural development reduces tree cover, making rising temperatures even deadlier for insects that are unable to find shade. Those that survive may then migrate to a new area that's not as well suited to them. "Our findings highlight the urgency of actions to preserve natural habitats, slow the expansion of high-intensity agriculture, and cut emissions to mitigate climate change," Outhwaite tells *BBC News*.

More Criminals Spared Jail Owing to Crowded Prisons

Growing numbers of criminals in England and Wales are being spared jail sentences because of prison overcrowding amid warnings that the problem will get worse. Judges and magistrates are giving people suspended sentences instead of jail terms on the back of guidance that they should take into account the “high prison population”.

Criminals who were given suspended sentences because of prison conditions include an inmate who poured boiling water over a prison guard, but had his six-month custodial sentence quashed, and a drug driver without a licence who had led the police on a high-speed chase.

Mark Beatties, the national chair of the Magistrates Association, said: “The high population is now a factor to be considered when the court is deciding between an immediate custodial sentence or a suspended sentence.”

Andrea Coomber KC, the chief executive of the Howard League for Penal Reform, said: “I do think that judges need to be thinking more about where they’re sentencing when they sentence somebody, where they’re sending them to, and what conditions they’re going to be in and whether that actually meets the various goals of sentencing, which do include rehabilitation, at a time when you have such an overcrowded system. It would be fantastic if the incoming lady Chief Justice [Sue Carr] would prioritise that as something in her inbox.”

Coomber said that the real culprit for prison overcrowding was sentencing inflation, as the judiciary has limited discretion when it comes to sentencing. “Government needs to take greater responsibility for the fact that sentences are getting longer and that they’re the ones doing that,” she said. “We’ve got many more people in that kind of bracket of four to 10 years than we used to have.”
